



MEDICAL Kittens spayed before the first heat have a 91% lower risk of developing mammary cancer which takes the lives of an estimated 75,000 cats every year. Spaying also eliminates the risk of pyometria.

BEHAVIORAL The hormones that develop if cats are left unaltered lead to nightly territorial fights, cat mating rituals and roaming. These unwanted behaviors often lead to relinquishment to shelters. Over 80% of cats relinquished to shelters or abandoned are unspayed/unneutered.

COMMUNITY Well over half the litters are "oops" litters - that end up in shelters or on the streets. Shelters are inundated with kittens, and older cats who may have found homes are often passed over. Cat complaint calls are at or near the top of the list in public health and animal control departments.


